Scene 2 - The Village of Bethany

30 A.D. and Jesus concludes his public ministry by bringing his disciples and his message to the Holy City, Jerusalem

Scene 3 - The Mount of Olives

Sunday - East of Jerusalem, along the road from Bethany to the Holy City

Scene 4 - The Temple in Jerusalem

Tuesday - Jesus visits the Court of the Gentiles, where money changers & vendors have created something like a bazaar

Scene 5 - Solomon's Portico

Wednesday - Jesus teaches in another part of the Temple compound

Scene 6 - The Residence of Annas

Thursday - Judas is persuaded that Jesus must die for the good of all Israel

ACT II

Scene 1 - The Upper Room

Thursday - Jesus and His disciples gather in a private home to eat the Passover meal

Scene 2 - The Garden of Gethsemane

That same evening, Jesus retreats to a favorite spot on the nearby Mount of Olives to pray about the ordeal he faces

Scene 3 - Pilate's Quarters

The High Priest, Caiaphas, insists upon an unscheduled audience with Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor of Judea

Scene 4 - The Garden of Gethsemane

Jesus continues in prayer even as Judas leads His enemies to arrestHim

Scene 5 - The Residence of Annas

Jesus is interrogated privately by Annas, and then brought to trial before hastily-assembled members of the Sanhedrin, Israel's high court

Scene 6 - Pilate's Quarters

Friday - Before dawn, Pilate's wife is awakened by a disturbing dream about Jesus

Scene 7 - Courtyard of Pilate's Palace

Friday morning, Jesus stands trial before Pilate, and briefly Herod. Both allow Him to be wrongfully condemned to death

Scene 8 - A Hill Outside Jerusalem

Friday forenoon through mid-afternoon, Jesus is crucified and thus dies by request of the Jews, at the hands of the Romans

Scene 9 - Near a tomb nearby

Sunday, a group of women coming to His tomb to anoint the body discover He has been raised from the dead

Scene 10 - The Upper Room

A week later, His apostles are all together when Jesus appears in their midst.

Scene 11 - Today

PROPHETS

Jesus continues calling everyone to turn back to God, to be forgiven and to receive the gift of eternal life through faith in Him.
